


President's Report Cont'd.

Due to the rapid growth of the Centre and the increased Secretarial work the Hon. Secretary, Mr A.V. Nichols, requested the committee to assign him an assistant. Mrs E.A. HUNTER was appointed to the position and has carried out the duties of Assistant Hon. Secretary in a conscientious and efficient manner.

During the year, the Committee have worked most harmoniously andefficiently for the well-being of the Centre and I would like to express O'I'm my appreciation for their support and co-operation.

I would like to thank them for organising the events on the program for the year and running them in such a capable manner.

Finance. The financial position of the Centre is very sound and there are no outstanding accounts or loans on the books. It is anticipated that the

Centre will finish the year with approximately £500/-/- im the bank. The financial year has been favourable in all aspects. The financial statement showing an excess of income ever expenditure of £361 for the year 1/7/59 to 30/6/60.

MEMBERSHIP.

The membership of the Centre has now reached 240 an increase of 32 since last year. This is an excellent indication of the growth of the Centre augers well for our activities in the coming year.

Meetings.

This year, only one Sprints Meeting was held in comparison to three last year. Unfortunately, a suitable circuit for this type of event was not available until very late in the year. However, your Committee is making every endeavour to arrange regular events of this type during the forthcoming year.

During the year, the sub-committees have worked with considerable zeal. Five Treasure Hunts, six Gymkhanas, one Interclub Gymkhana, one Concours D'Elegance, three Barbeques, two Scavenger Hunts, six Film Evenings, one Odds and Ends Night, two Club Runs, a tour of the Ford Assembly Plant and a tour of the Australian Paper Mill were held. The attendance at most events has been most gratifying.

OCTAGON.

Your Committee decided to continue the Octagon in the form which was introduced late last year. In this form, with the printed cover and duplicated centre, the magazine can be brought out regularly every month full of articles of topical interest.

I would like to thank the Editor, Mrs E.A. Hunter, and the Octagon sub-committee for producing a refreshing, pleasant reading magazine on our Centres activities.

CLUB ROOMS.

With the rapid expansion of the Centre, it is obvious that our Club Rooms are becoming too small to accommodate, with comfort, the Members who attend on a Friday night. Yours Committee has endeavoured to obviate the inconvenience but, unfortunately, no immediate solution presents itself.

However, I would like to comment on the activities of the House sub-committee who have kept the Club Rooms in an immaculate condition throughout the yearand the improvements they have made. Also the tea provided by the ladies which is an appreciative conclusion to meeting nights.

Stocks of cigarettes, tobacco and soft drinks have increased. Offering members a great selection. Sales have increased and a rease onable profit is being made by the Canteen.

GYMKHANA GROUNDS.

Early in the year, the Aspley Show Grounds, which we have regularly rented for gymkhanas became unsuitable. Mr D. Heather suggested another venue on a property at Stanton Road, Tingalpa owned by Mr. Porter. Your committee examined the property and a section was found suitable for use as a Gymkhana Ground. Negotiations were entered into with Mr. Porter for the rental or lease of the selected section of his property. A lease was duly signed by both parties.

4 President's Report concluded.

Here is a brief summary of the conditions of the lease for the Gymkhana Ground at Stanton Road. Tingalpa.

The lease is for three years with the option of a further three years if taken within thirty days of expiry. Right to remove all buildings improvements and fixtures on the expiration of the lease. Access to the grounds at all times via Stanton Road. Right to sub-let for use as a Gymkhana Ground.

Your Committee decided to launch the grounds off to a good start with the Interclub Gymkhana. The amount of time and energy devoted to the project by the gymkhana sub-committee and the members and friends who assisted them to prepare the grounds and organise the Interclub Gymkhana was tremendous. The success of the event is a substantial measure of their enthusiasm.

GENERAL.

I would like to thank those members of the Trials, Speed, Octagon, House, and Gymkhana sub-committees and the Club Captain, Mr. R.V. Davis, who so ably organised the running of these events. Mr & Mrs Muller for making their home available for Barbeques and all the members for their co-operation and assistance in conducting the events. I hope the President and Committee elected to office in 1961 will receive the same assistance and co-operation that I have received during the past year.

In conclusion, I would like to thank Messrs Howards Limited for the invitation to our Centre to view the record breaking M.G. EX181. Also Messrs U.K.Motors for their invitation to view the record breaking EX 179.
