SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

JURISDICTION: The **CLUB HILL CLIMB** Event will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, The Hill Climb Standing Regulation and these Supplementary Regulations and any further Supplementary Regulations or Bulletins which may be issued.

This Event will be held in accordance with Motorsport Australia's Occupational Health and Safety Policy, Integrity Policies, Legal Policies, Risk Management Policies, Safety 1st Framework and any other relevant Policy.

2. ELIGIBILITY OF COMPETITORS. Persons eligible to compete are the Competitors and Drivers who are members of M.G. Car Club of Queensland Inc or other Motorsport Australia affiliated club. (Points will be awarded to usual MG Car Club Perpetual Trophies).

Relief Drivers are not allowed on dual entries.

MINIMUM LICENCES: Current Motorsport Australia Speed/Speed Junior Licence or above. Club membership and Motorsport Australia vehicle Log Book (if issued) must be shown.

3. ENTRIES

- (a) **Entries** open upon publication of these Regulations and **will close on Thursday 19 February, 2026**
- (b) Entries must be completed online with the Motorsport Australia entry portal system.
- (c) The Entry fee will be \$150.00
- (d) **The number of entries may be limited to 90 Competitors. Acceptance of entries will be in order of mail receipt.**
- (e) Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR.

4. DOCUMENTATION

Documentation check will be at the Secretary's Office in the containers near the Scrutineering Area.

Please bring the following documents

- * Current Motorsport Australia Affiliated Car Club Membership Card and MSA licence..
- * Motorsport Australia Vehicle Log Book - must be presented for all vehicles other than Road Registered Vehicles – Refer Schedule L.
- * Motorsport Australia Certificate of Description (5th Category only) - other than Group N & S.
- * 3rd party extension Certificate (CTP) for Qld Road Registered Vehicles only.
- * Completed Statement of Vehicle of Compliance Form

5. VEHICLES

(a) Vehicle Categories and Classes:

As per Motorsport Australia Manual or club specific. Classes and capacity classes will be determined by the entries received for the Event. The Organiser's reserves the right to add and/or alter the categories and capacity classes at their discretion and re-classify vehicles. The Hillclimb Committee and Chief Scrutineer will determine the eligibility of an entrant vehicle. There will be no Electric Vehicles eligible.

NOTE: All Queensland road registered cars (Trade Plates are not acceptable) must have an original 3rd Party extension certificate on their current Qld Transport Registration provided by the 3rd Party insurer, specifically covering the days of each competition.

OTHER CLASSES MAY BE ADDED DEPENDING ON THE ENTRIES RECEIVED

(c) ALL AUTOMOBILES MUST BE FITTED WITH AN EFFICIENT MUFFLER TO LIMIT NOISE BELOW 95dB.

Noise readings will be taken during the first run and randomly thereafter. Cars exceeding the 95dB limit will only be given one opportunity to modify their exhaust before continuing. If the vehicle exceeds the noise limit a second time ***they will be disqualified from the Event***. For any run in which the noise limit is exceeded, no time will be recorded. (NLE – Noise Limit Exceeded). Judges of Fact for the noise measurements will be the appointed Sound Monitor, Chief Scrutineer and Clerk of the Course.

(d) Fuel shall comply with Technical Appendix Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual.

(e) Fire Extinguishers: - All fire extinguishers must comply with Technical Appendix Schedule H of the Motorsport Manual.

It is a condition of entry that Competitors agree to pay all costs incurred by the MG Car Club of Qld. Inc. for the use of any fire fighting equipment on any vehicles used /operated by the Driver/Drivers/ Pit Crew.

(f) Any competition vehicle with a fitted roll cage (Motorsport Australia log booked or not) shall comply with Technical Appendix Schedule J in the Motorsport Manual.

(g) Seat Belts: All vehicles must comply with Technical Appendix Schedule I of the Motorsport Australia Manual.

(h). No cameras etc are permitted to be attached to helmets. Any on-board camera attachment must be approved by Scrutineers.

(i) All Apparel including Helmet and Body Protection shall comply with Technical Appendix Schedule D in the Motorsport Manual

6. SCRUTINY TIME AND PLACE

Scrutiny will be conducted at this event. Scrutiny will start at the Scrutiny Bay from 8.15 am on Saturday and 7.30 am Sunday on the days of the event. Your log book and apparel is required at scrutiny. All Competitors licences will be checked prior to the Event via the Motorsport Australia Portal. Please take your Statement of Vehicle Compliance Form, copy of Third Party Extension if applicable and club membership card to the Secretary's Office prior to Scrutiny.

- (a) Numbers allocated in the Entry List must also be in the appropriate places on the vehicle as per the Motorsport Australia Manual.
- (b) Parc Ferme is the area covered by the scrutineering roofed area.
- (c) The Chief Scrutineer or his nominee shall be the Judge of Fact in all matters pertaining to the safety of a vehicle, equipment or clothing, including all mounting points for video cameras etc (including "Go-Pro" types.)
- (d) ALL CARS MUST BE FITTED WITH AN EFFICIENT MUFFLER TO LIMIT NOISE TO 95dB.

Vehicles shall comply with Technical Appendix Schedule A & B of the Motorsport Australia Manual.
Non-complying vehicles may be excluded from the Event

7. DRIVERS BRIEFING:

10.45 am Saturday of the competition at the Scrutiny shed unless advised otherwise.

8.15am Sunday of the competition at the Scrutiny shed.

Attendance at the Driver's briefing is compulsory, fines may apply for failure to sign the driver's sign-on sheet
Any changes will be advised by the Public Address system.

8. STARTING TIME Official timed runs will commence at

11.00am on Saturday of the competition and

8:30am on Sunday of the competition, unless otherwise notified in Further Regulations.

9. COMPETITION:

(a) Running order will be as published.

(b) FTD and Class winners will be the Drivers with the fastest time in each class **and/or** outright.

10. GENERAL:

(a) The Organiser reserves the right to postpone or cancel the Event in accordance with the NCR.

(b) *Competitors permanent racing numbers will be allocated where possible. Competitors must use the number shown on the official list of entries. This number must be displayed on both sides of the vehicle in a professional manner.*

(c) Protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.

(d) Any Further Regulations, Bulletins and Results will be posted to the Notice Board beside the Canteen.

(e) ACCESS TO TIMING AND TRACK:

The timing shed shall be out of bounds to all except those in an official capacity. Should it be necessary for a Competitor to speak to an Official, they may come to the back door but must remain outside until a necessary Official attends to them.

Competitors/Pit Crews/Spectators **are not permitted to enter the circuit in the event of an incident unless directed by Senior Official.** Pit crew members are not allowed past the Armco onto the start pad.

(f) Speed Limit in Pits 10 kph, penalties may be applied if directions given by Officials are not followed.

(g) Driving around the Pits to warm up cars or registered cars leaving the circuit to warm up cars is prohibited

(h) False Starts: Once the beam has been broken, the run is deemed to have begun. A pushback restart will not be allowed. No artificial means of holding the vehicle on the start line will be permitted.
Pit crew members are not allowed past the Armco onto the start pad unless directed.

(i) Track boundary marker cones: Dislodging a cone (as advised by a Judge of Fact) may incur a 5 second penalty as determined by the Stewards.

(i) Change of Driver will be permitted under the NCR.

(j) Results will be published on the Club website www.mgccq.org.au within the required 72 hours. Those requiring mailed results should advise the Event Secretary accordingly.

(k) This event may include Driver Training according to the Passenger in Vehicle Regulations.

(l) Timing Gear: Drivers may be asked to make restitution for any damage caused by them to the timing gear.

(m) Smoking (including e-cigarettes and vaping) and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling or defueling operation.

Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and relevant Policies, including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy, Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy and the Alcohol Policy, apply to any activity sanctioned by Motorsport Australia.

Any participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia.

Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

11. INSURANCE

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

12. AWARDS:

The following awards will be presented on the day :-

The Organisers reserve the right to make additional awards.

Where the winner of a competition class breaks the existing class record, the driver shall be presented with a bottle of champagne. Irrespective of the number of times a driver breaks the existing class record at the one Event, only one bottle of champagne will be presented.

Where the driver of an MG vehicle breaks an existing MG record and the new record is to be current at the conclusion of the Event, the driver will be presented with a bottle of champagne. Irrespective of the number of times the driver breaks the existing MG record at the one meeting, only one bottle of champagne will be presented.

Where the winner of a competition class breaks the existing class record, is under 18 years of age, a substitute for the champagne will be presented.

MG records are not Series Competition Class records and are not eligible for Series record points.
(MG class records internal club records only).

Annual awards (Including Top Six, Kay Hawley Encouragement Award for the best Female Driver, MGCCQ Encouragement Award for the best Male Driver, Russell Crew Memorial Trophy for Best MG and Best Young Driver, as per Standing Regulations – Yearly Trophies Presented at a yearly Award Presentation.

Please Note: Historic class records only recognised if vehicle has a Motorsport Australia Historic Logbook

REFUND OF MONIES shall be conditional upon the following:-

Notification before Close of Entries by phone and then in writing – 100% Refund.

Notification 2 days after close of entries by phone then in writing, full refund less \$20.00.

NO REFUND WILL BE CONSIDERED 3 days after close of entries.

If upon Entry with payment, you feel that the vehicle may not be completed in time, please enclose a note with your entry so the Organisers may be aware of your problem.
