


AUSTRALIAN TOURING CAR CHAMPIONSHIPS LOWOOD 3rd Sept. by Teddy Boy.

Those who attended the Australian Touring Car Championships meeting at Lowood on September 3rd were treated to some fine driving displays by various competitors.

The first event, the Restricted Sports Car Race, was won by Mrs Ann Thomson's Lotus in the capable hands of Alan Reed. Mrs Thomson is a prominent and consistant member of the Club and, as the Queensland Centre sponsored this race, it was doubly pleasing to see her car win.

Tim Harlock's Centaur, powered by a 105E engine, similarto Mrs Thomson's Lotus was second, an XK120 Jaguar third and our good friend, Bill Gates, fourth in his well prepared TR3A.

· In the Holden Car Scratch Race, N.S.W's Bob Holden was first very closely followed by Cec Keid in his F.J. Holden. Cec was driving very nicely and looks like providing quite a hazard to the other Holden men. Lionel Ayers was third in this, having dropped back with engine trouble.

The main event, the Australian Touring Car Champion-ship was spectacular indeed for the first few laps. Ian Geoghegan was out in front in the 3.4 Jaguar, Ron Hodgson's 3.8 second and Bill Pitt third. However, with Pitts excellent driving he was soon second and in chase of the flying 3.4 of Geoghegan.

Both had broken Pitt's lap record in practice and continued to lap well below this figure. Pitt's ultimate best time was a new record of 2Min. 3.7 Seconds.

Bob Jane's white 3.8 Jaguar retired with mechanical trouble, leaving Bill Burns, in the ex Mackay 3.4 fourth behind Hodgson.

Bev. Fleming, in his Lotus 1100, had a victory in the Sports Car Scratch Race., which was run concurrently with the G.T. race and Denis Geary, in the Lotus Elite, came second to Bob Jane's ex Moss Maseratti 300S and Harry Cape third in the Twin Cam Coupe.

The last race, the Mt. Tarampa Handicap, was won by Bill Gates in the TR3A. We are very pleased to see this as Bill has not been blessed with the best of luck lately Tim Harlock was a close second in the Centaur with Barry Campbell third in his immaculate red M.G.A.1600. Glad to see Barry score a place.

Brian Pettitt, out for the first time in his Sprite, showed good form and stayed close to the N.S.W. M.G.A. of F. Ausina.

Other Queensland Centre members competing were, Doug Bright, (M.G.T.C.) J. Spartacus (W.R.M.) C. Roman in the blown M.G.A. 1600 and John Sherman in his Falcon.

All in all, a very good day.
