

About

The Mt Cotton Hillclimb situated on Gramzow Rd at Mount Cotton has been operating continuously since February 1968.

It is owned and managed by the MG Car Club of Queensland Inc. Situated in a parklike bushland setting the facility is well maintained by an industrious group of Club volunteers.

The Hillclimb circuit is a bitumen surface, 946 metres in length.

Considered as one of the most challenging Hillclimb tracks in Australia, the layout offers a variety of steep climbs, rapid descents, hairpins and corners with varying cambers.



Competition Rules

Events are held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules of Motorsport Australia (MA) and the Speed Event Standing Regulations. Events will be conducted under and in accordance with MA OH&S and Risk Management Policies which can be found on the MA website at www.motorsport.org.au

Supplementary regulations for each event are published at mgccq.org.au/entryforms.

Further regulations may be published during the event.

Driver Protective Apparel (PPE)

- Non Synthetic Clothing extending to neck, ankles and wrists..
- Non-synthetic shoes.
- Personal Crash Helmet compliant to current Australian Safety Standards.

Driver's apparel, including helmet, is to be as per Schedule D of the current MA Manual of Motor Sport and must be presented to the scrutineers for inspection.

Entry

Entry to any event is subject to the published regulations. Online entry is available through the Motorsport Australia Membership Portal.

Entry Fees are payable on entry.

Entry fees may vary from event to event and are published in the Supplementary Regulations.



Vehicle Requirements

Generally, a vehicle must have:

- 1kg fire extinguisher fitted.
- Glass headlights taped. (e.g. Clear contact adhesive material or similar)
- · Vehicle in a clean and safe condition.
- A Roll Cage is NOT a requirement at Club level Hillclimbs.
- Queensland Road Registered Vehicles require a 'Motorsport Extension' to their compulsory third party insurance certificate (obtained from your vehicles CTP insurer.)

All vehicles will comply with Schedules A and B of the General Requirements for Cars and Drivers as per the current MA Manual of Motor Sport. Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current MA Manual of Motor Sport and all vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions – below 95dB.
