M.G. INTERNATIONAL 1977

This year's M.G. Annual with feature stories and reports on events worldwide in 1976 is a worthy companion to the previous three.

It has a colour MGB cover and is hard-bound with 144 pages. Editor, Dick Knudson has been in Abingdon for a year and researched some more interesting information about the marque.

John Thornley pays tribute to three long-standing important M.G. Car Company employees who recently died and Knudson reveals why the TC was named as one of the world's "Milestone" cars in a lengthy piece.

Dutchman John Bekker tells of an epic 10,000 mile TD journey to the North Cape in Norway thro! Russia and Rumania behind the iron curtain to places where the inhabitants had obviously never seen a sports car before. His photos with unique backdrops are as fascinating as his story.

Mike Allison of "Magic of M.G." fame tells us the life of NA which is chequered indeed and Norman Ewing describes the M.G. life of South African Les Miller, a name synonymous with motor racing in his homeland.

Fully reproduced is a brochure dating from 1932 describing what the M.G. Car Company was all about. Line drawings of factory assembly procedures are included plus photos which have reproduced beautifully. A chance for everyone to read a unique document so close to our hearts.

This is carried a step further with a pictorial record of present day MGB and Midget building which few of us will get to see for ourselves, and the MGB story.

Also illustrated are several design exercises constructed as complete cars which never reached production together with factory modern competition built cars.

M.G. International 1977 Cont'd.

The round up of events covers those in UK plus the bicentennial rally for M.G.s only thro; the 13 original States of America that made the United States. The prize was the 1,000,000 car built at Abingdon - an MGB 50th year celebration model.

The triennial M.G. International Rally at Hausach is covered with a picture of an R type as well as three VAs all from different countries.

Mike Ellman Brown tells his H.G. life and fixation for Woodland Green cars but especially the last MGA twin cam which was purposefully built for him and has been frugally used ever since.

A profile of Gordon Cobban, the home centre General Secretary, shows the energy and love devoted to M.G.s and M.G. people by him and Elsie his wife.

Lastly there is reproduced a sales leaflet of the C type or Montlhery Midget and another leaflet titled "For the Racing Motorist" covering the J4 and K3 and wait for it - the J5 Midget. You will have to buy this book just to find out what this J5 was shich has never before been mentioned in any authoritative book on the marque.

I'm sure I've treated you to sufficient insight to make its purchase irresistable at \$12.50 plus \$2 p&p. Bulk orders from Centre Secretaries welcome. It also makes a great trophy or prize.
