#### GRAND PRIX MAZDA RALLY 1985

You wouldn't read about it, or rather you would and you're going to. It rained. Our good friends Joe Camilleri and Ross Moir had again sponsored our round of the Queensland Rally Championship and everybody got their feet wet. Probably Joe should have stayed here to see that there was no such nonsense, but he was holidaying in Japan and nobody else thought of saying "Don't rain", so it did - for the third year running.

The start was at the Pick 'n Pay Hypermarket at Aspley (just opposite Grand Prix Mada's pad) where we had had two cars on display all week. The result was a good crowd to have a look at the rally cars and to see them off. Unfortunately the Special Stage that we intended to run near Kallangur was far too soggy to be used, and so the spectators didn't have the chance to watch the cars in action, unless they went up to Benarkin (near Blackbutt). The crews had plenty of time on their hands and nothing to do with it. Most of them lay around in the SUN at Moore, ate, drank and talked about cars and rallies. We have a suspicion that a few north-side dwellers snuck home for an new or lwo!

Came the dark and they were off on the first special stage. There was a wonderful spectator point where you could see the cars go (1) hard left (2) about a minute later they appeared down a horrid little track, very steep, leading to a T junction where they went night, (3) they disappeared via another hard left and a wriggly bridge, and then uphill. Good viewing. After this the field left for Googs Forest to do one long Special Stage and two short ones, and the rains came.

The Director, a couple of Assistant Directors and the Course Checker set forth to inspect roads. Just as they were discussing what parts of Tanonse Morest could still be used a violent storm settled the question - no roads in Taromeo, just creeks.

Meanwhile the field, except for those few who got begged in Googa, struggled through another special stage in Benarkin. Another spectabular spectator point - for those brave enough to slither their way there.

Again the intrepid senior officials went out in search of roads. They found them too - lots of them. Driving along them was a different matter. They were those nice slick, yellowy clayey tracks where there's no traction at all and vehicles, even four wheel drives, flounder happily into drains, posts, trees and anywhere except where you're trying to go. We found two more short stages that were just usable and that was that. Our 165 km relly had turned into a 95 km rally.

Certainly the worst off were the control officers who were soaked and frozen. We two them a lot for putting up with such conditions. We also must specially mention Norm Singleton and Paul Jones: They charged valuantly to the aid of an inverted Pat Hetherman and got begged in their Holden ute. They weren't only cold and wet but footsome too, because they had to walk out. They were in charge of that bit of the rally so there was nobody to come to the rescue. They came in for hot soup (courtesy of Bev Cosser) and departed with a winch to commence burrowing operations.

Bruce Nicol, in charge at Rally Headquarters, is nearly as old a hand at M.G. rallies as Neil. Another unflappable character.

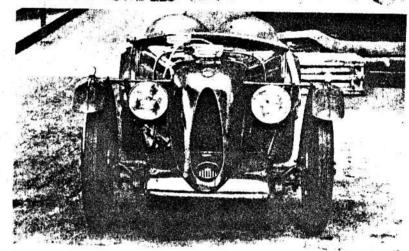

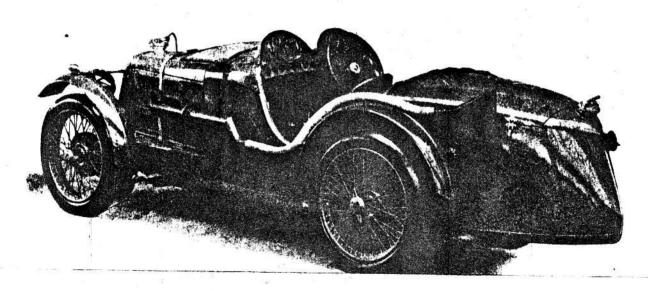






More shots of the C-type displaying its attractive shape from all angles. The radiator cowl was discarded after the 1931 Double Twelve in which the cars filled the first 5 places.
